## This Issue's Focus: After Hours

I recently sat down with our Program Director, Jason Kitson, to talk with him about The Vault's After Hours Program. Here is a synopsis of our discussion.

### What is "After Hours" and what is its purpose?

After Hours is a weekly program that offers enrichment classes on Mondays and Tuesdays after regular hangout time. These classes provide a variety of educational and experiential opportunities that align with The Vault's goals to develop well-rounded students.

#### How many After Hours programs do you offer per month?

On average we provide sixteen different programs each month. These programs vary from 1-week to 4-week programs covering a variety of experiences from cooking to robotics, sewing to self-defense, and conversational skills to car care.

#### Who teaches the classes?

Some classes are taught by Vault staff, but most classes are taught by local community individuals, leaders, teachers, and partners who share their professional talents and experiences.

#### Can you highlight one of the classes for next semester?

Yes! Through a generous grant from The Write Stuff, we are able to offer a new class called "Culinary Arts Life Skills" where students are taught how to make different dishes each week. After the class, they get to eat the dish that was prepared. We love this concept -- feeding our students' minds and stomachs!

#### What impact are you seeing in the students?

Every week our teens are being challenged to try and learn something new. During a 2-4 week program, we see confidence develop as they begin to take ownership of what they are learning. It's exciting to see our students growing in all different areas of life!

#### Who We Are

The Vault is a teen center in the heart of Central Illinois with a mission to help teens recognize their value, realize their potential, and reach their goals. With a facility of over 10,000 sq. feet, we offer a fun and safe environment where teens can hang out with friends; build relationships with adult mentors; participate in programs, clubs, classes, and career camps to enrich their futures; take part in community service projects; and learn business and leadership skills through our café and student leadership teams.
